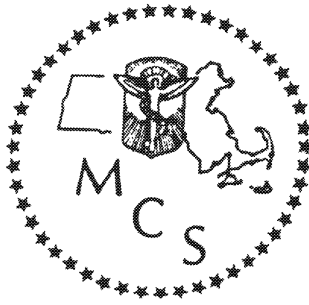




Press Release – October 17, 2025
